The <u>AU-EU Innovation Agenda</u> is a joint policy initiative that will guide the next decade of cooperation in Science, Technology and Innovation between Africa and Europe, with the aim of fostering the translation of research and innovation into tangible products, services, businesses and jobs. On the EU side, the AU-EU Innovation Agenda is a strategic partnership supported by the <u>Global Gateway</u> and <u>Horizon Europe</u>. The joint Agenda has four objectives, translated into short, medium- and long-term actions, in the four priority areas of AU-EU cooperation in research and innovation, namely Public Health, Green Transition, Innovation and Technology, and Capacities for Science, as well as the additional area of Cross-cutting Issues.
