## **KIWi Policy Talk**

Based on current developments in a country or a region, KIWi offers expert discussions illuminating and discussing issues of higher education policy from different angles. KIWi Policy Talks are aimed at a wider academic audience and provide impulses for the further development of international scientific cooperation. In addition, experts may be invited to address sensitive topics closed-shop in a safe setting.

#### **KIWi Lab**

These workshop formats provide participants with the opportunity to discuss trends and topics of international co-operation in a small groups. With the help of external expertise from experienced professionals, participants work together on innovative solutions. The format also helps further develop the information and consulting services of KIWi in a demand-oriented manner.

#### **KIWi Connect**

In direct dialogue with their peers, stakeholder within the field of internationalisation exchange experiences and develop solutions to practical challenges in academic co-operations. Experienced project leaders present examples of good practice and share their learning experiences, so that new projects can be successfully initiated and implemented.

### **Publications**

KIWi offers various country-specific publications for German universities and research institutions, such as infographics, country reports and system analyses for roughly 80 countries. These analyses can be digitally compared and evaluated according to specific interests.

KIWi Impuls presents the results of KIWi Policy Talks and the DAAD's recommendations for international academic co-operations with selected countries, regions and on selected topics.

KIWi Kompass provides German universities and academic institutions with orientation and guidelines during the initiation and implementation phase of international collaborations.
